

AV Screen Buying Guide for Schools & Trusts

A quick guide to planning, buying
and installing AV screens





Why are you investing?

- ✓ Replace ageing projectors / whiteboards
- ✓ Improve visibility and sound in teaching spaces
- ✓ Support more interactive teaching
- ✓ Upgrade halls, receptions and meeting rooms
- ✓ Standardise kit across a school or trust

You won't need the same screens everywhere, so it's helpful to think in room types: classrooms, large teaching spaces, halls, offices/meeting rooms, and public areas.

Key decisions



Screen size

Typical choices:

- **65"** – most classrooms
- **75"** – deeper rooms / larger groups
- **86"+** – halls and big spaces

Check: can pupils at the back read text, and do you have enough clear wall?



Interactive vs non-interactive

- **Interactive** – annotation, pens, touch; best for classrooms, SEN and training rooms.
- **Non-interactive** – display only; good for halls, signage and some meeting rooms.

Often a mix (interactive in classrooms, non-interactive in halls/public areas) gives best value.?



Wall-mounted vs mobile

- **Wall-mounted:** permanent, tidy, no floor space used.
- **Mobile / trolley:** one screen shared across rooms, handy for halls and overflow spaces.

Check: wall type, power/data, height, door widths and storage.



Connectivity & audio

Confirm:

- Inputs you need (HDMI, USB-C, wireless casting)
- Whether you want built-in PC/OPS or will always use laptops
- Audio needs – built-in speakers vs soundbar / external speakers in halls



Practicalities



Installation & disruption

- Term time vs holiday work
- Access to halls, receptions and secure areas
- Any “no drilling” or listed building constraints
- Expectations around cable routes and finish



Staff confidence

- Short, simple training at go-live
- Quick “how to” prompts by each screen



Cost, support and sustainability



Look beyond headline price

- Warranty length and what it actually covers
- On-site vs return-to-base support
- Response / fix times
- Included services: install, training, removal of old kit



Build in sustainability

- Take-back and recycling of old kit
- WEEE-compliant disposal
- Energy use and power-saving features
- Refurbished options for non-teaching spaces (where appropriate)
